Title of Report	Interim Report on Implementation of Action Plan for Best Value Review of Services to Disabled children
Purpose of Report	To provide Members with a progress report of work in hand

RECOMMENDATION

1. To note progress made.

1. Financial Appraisal

1.1 It is anticipated that the cost in this financial year of appointing a senior manager to develop a joint strategic framework will be £15,000; this will be met from the base budget. It is anticipated that the full year cost will be around £45,000, partly funded by partner agencies.

2. Supporting Information

2.1 A report of the Best Value Review of Services to Disabled Children was presented to the County Council on 3rd April 2001 along with an action plan, responding to key recommendations.

2.2 The key finding and recommendations were in relation to the establishment and appointment of a Senior Manager with responsibility for the development of a "joint strategic framework" and the joint commissioning of services (Appendix A, 7.1 - 7.2)

2.3 There has been some delay in securing funding for this post; however, it is anticipated that the new post will be filled by the end of 2001. Significant progress has been made despite the delay in securing funding for the dedicated manager.

2.4 Appendix B, details progress against items 7.3 - 7.9 of the action plan, which were agreed as the priorities for the current year, as well as other elements of the work programme.

2.5 The "Disabled Children's Development Group" (see App.B, 7.11) has agreed that the "Best Value" action plan will be the priority for its work programme. This group has also been formally and more firmly linked to the Children's Services Planning Team. The group has representation from statutory agencies, parents, carers and providers of services from the voluntary sector.

2.6 It is intended that a final report of the action plan will be presented to this Committee at it's meeting in March 2002.
