### **Q4** comment for KST

Two of the performance measures for Key Stage 2 (KS2) and Key Stage 4 (KS4) have been met. The two which have not been met (percentage of looked after children aged 11 attaining at least level 4 in Mathematics and percentage of looked after children aged 16 attaining at least 5 A-C grades at GCSE or equivalent) have seen significant increases this year and the targets have only narrowly been missed and actions plans are in place to meet the Government's challenging targets by the summer of 2006.

However, behaviour continues to be a major concern and the "Behaviour Board" (established as part of the Behaviour Support to Schools Strategy) has established a work programme for 2005/06 and will monitor progress on behaviour in schools.

However, the rate of improvement this year is twice the national average and we are the second most improved shire in the country. Our results for English are now above the national average and in line for mathematics. We received a letter from David Miliband (Schools Minister) congratulating us on being one of the 20 most improved LEAs in the country since 2001. Increased emphasis needs to be placed on improving our 5+A\*-G percentages. Actions for 2005/06 are set out in the Education Development Plan and summarised in the Council Plan 2005/06. Improved KS4 curriculum offer, particularly in relation to vocational qualifications, is a priority in the EDP and additional resources have been targeted.
