Autistic Spectrum Disorder

Reducing teenage pregnancies

The combined Reintegration and Secondary Behaviour Support Service

The committee received an update report in March 2008 regarding recent developments in the Reintegration Service and the Secondary Behaviour Support Service following the reorganisation of them in April 2007. Further work was now being undertaken to combine these two services into one and members asked that feedback be provided to them on how this change of provision impacted on service users.
