	Performance monitoring by scrutiny is now largely undertaken as part of individual scrutiny reviews and only by the scrutiny committee on an exception basis. When the committee requests an overview, a quarterly performance monitoring report is added to the agenda. These reports summarise the Council's performance of those activities within the committee's terms of reference. Key service targets assessed as 'amber' or 'red' would automatically be included in any report: • 'Amber' – indicates that there is concern about the likelihood of achieving the performance target by the end of the year; includes recommendations for action • 'Red' – indicates that the performance target is assessed as unachievable or inappropriate.
