Purpose of Report:	To update the Panel on changes in the last quarter

Recommendation: The Corporate Parenting Panel is recommended to note the contents of the report

1. Financial Appraisal

1.1 Services for looked after children are funded from the Children's Services base budget, supplemented by the Care Matters Grant.

2. Supporting information

2.1 The most recent LAC Statistics are attached as **Appendix 1**.

2.2 Between April–June 2010, the upward trend in the number of LAC has continued with a rise of 21 children in this quarter. This is in line with the wider experience nationally.

2.3 During this quarter, the number of children in foster care has increased by 24, of whom 9 are placed with in house foster carers. There are two additional children with kinship carers. The pressure on the fostering service has continued and it is now at full capacity on some days, resulting in an increase of 13 agency fostering placements in this period.

2.4 The number of children placed with prospective adopters has dropped by 1 over this period. Activity rates are obviously closely allied to individual care planning for children and activity at panel remains steady.

2.5 The number of children subject to a Care Order placed at home with their parents stands at 18. These placements are monitored rigorously in order to mitigate any risk factors.

2.6 The number of children subject to Residence Orders or Special Guardianship Orders has increased to 180 over this quarter.

2.7 The heavy demand for parent and child placements continues. At the end of June we had 8 parent and baby placements provided by independent fostering providers and 3 provided in house by East Sussex parent and baby foster carers.

2.8 The current situation is that Acorns has 3 children in full time placement and the Bungalow has 2 children. This stems from various reasons including one child who has been effectively abandoned to our care and another for whom there has been a family breakdown. Planning is underway for all of them.

2.9 During this period 2 East Sussex children have been subject to secure orders on welfare grounds with both of them secured in in-house provision at Lansdowne.

3. Conclusion and Reason for Recommendations
