Title of Report: Looked After Children (LAC) Statistics

Purpose of Report: To update the Panel on changes in the last quarter

Recommendation: The Corporate Parenting Panel is recommended to note the contents

of the report.

1. Financial Appraisal

1.1 Services for Looked After Children are funded from the Children's Services base budget, supplemented by the Care Matters Grant. Clearly rising LAC numbers are putting the available budgets under intense pressure.

2. Supporting information

- 2.1 The most recent LAC Statistics are attached as Appendix 1.
- 2.2 Between April and June 2011, the upward trend in the overall number of LAC has continued with a large increase of 33 children in this quarter. This is almost twice the increase shown in the last quarter.
- 2.3 During this quarter, the total number of children in foster care has increased by 35, with 16 additional placements with in house foster carers at the end of the quarter. There are 13 additional agency foster placements at the end of this quarter. There has also been an increase of 6 children with kinship carers.
- 2.3 The number of children placed with prospective adopters has risen slightly over this period. Activity rates are obviously closely allied to individual care planning for children.
- 2.4 The number of children subject to a Care Order placed at home with their parents has dropped steadily over the quarter, possibly as the result of some strengthened review of individual children following a previous rise in numbers. These placements should always be monitored rigorously in order to mitigate any risk factors.
- 2.5 The number of children subject to Residence Orders has risen by 3 with 18 additional children being subject to Special Guardianship Orders.
- 2.6 Full time placements in both Acorns and the Bungalow continue as a response to a combination of individual family situations and ongoing budget pressures. There are still 4 children living in Acorns and 1 child in the Bungalow, with a further 4 children, 2 in each unit, having shared care packages in that they spend part of each week with their family.
- 2.8 During this period 4 East Sussex children have been subject to secure orders on welfare grounds with all 4 currently secured in in-house provision at Lansdowne.

3. Conclusion and recommendation

3.1 Pressure on the system remains very intense but overall staff are responding well. As yet we can see no sign of overall numbers having reached a plateau.
