

Appendix 3 - Draft Prioritisation Framework for Dropped Kerbs

East Sussex County Council recognises the importance of the provision of dropped kerbs in order to enable easy access within or to places for people using mobility aids, including wheelchairs or mobility scooters, people who are visually impaired or have health conditions or impairments which impacts on their mobility, along with providing access for people using pushchairs and prams.

Due to the high volume of requests received and the limited amount of funding available to deliver these, requests from members of the public are prioritised by considering the following factors:-

- who the request has been received from,
- whether there is an existing safety issue(s)
- areas with the highest level of pedestrian flow
- provide access to key service provision
